Instructions:

Step 1: Select one of your partnership or community collaboration projects to map and complete steps 2-4 on the following worksheet.

Step 2: List the project's stakeholders by category.

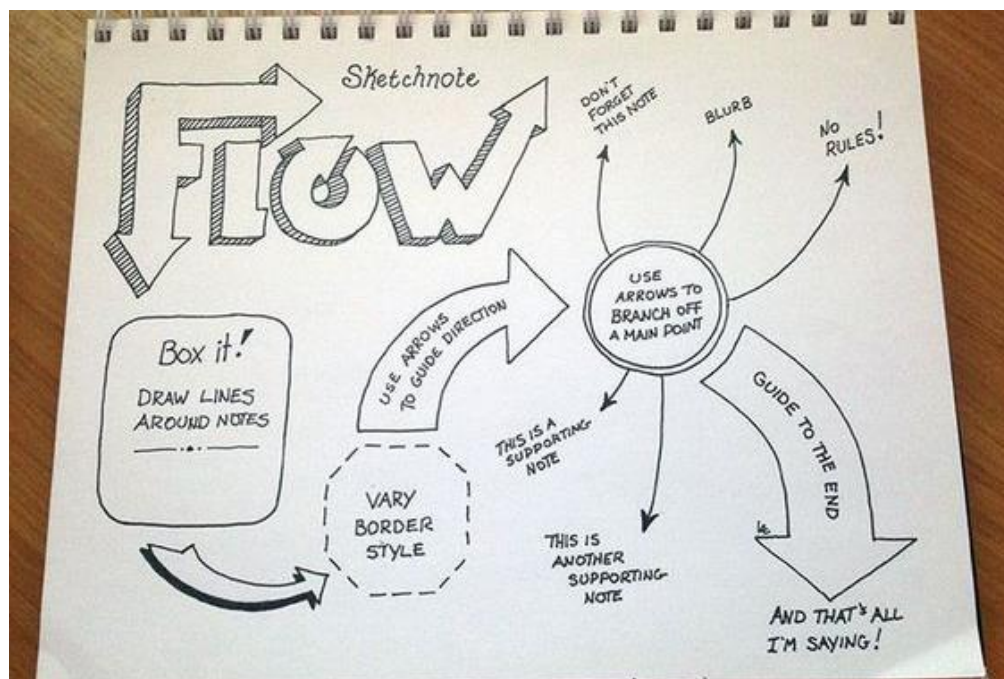
Step 3: Identify how each stakeholder will impact the project's decision-making space. Use the decision-making space abbreviations, as a handy reference. Note: Preservation and Recreational Areas and Educational and Interpretative Themes have been added to decision-making space characteristics and function similar to ecological boundaries.

Step 4: Record if this stakeholder's impact on decision-making space [$>$] expands, [$<$] decreases or [$=$] maintains the project's scale.

Step 5: Based on your data collection, consider the following next steps. **Do you need to:**

- identify stakeholders to fill gaps that are critical to your success?
- reassess the project's goal and objectives relevant to stakeholder contributions that define the project's decision-making space?
- create a graphic illustration of the project's stakeholders and decision-making space with stakeholders, partners and/or agency colleagues?
