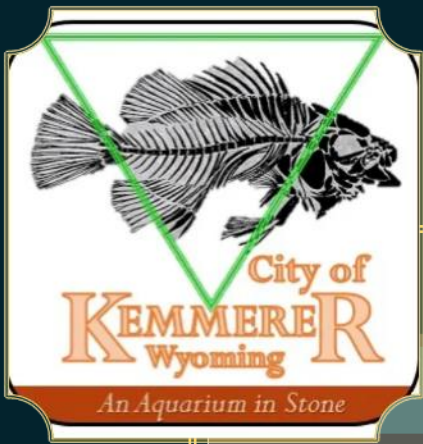


## Requirements

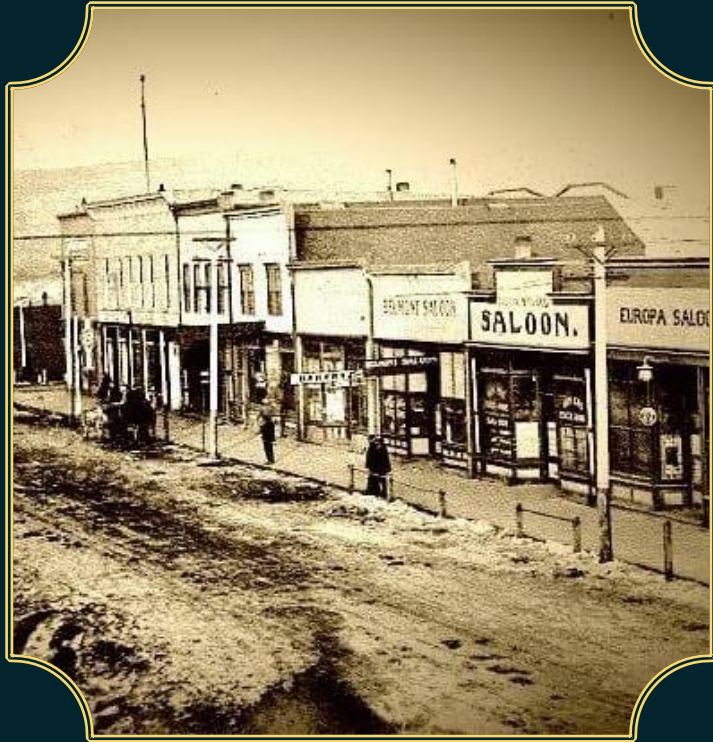

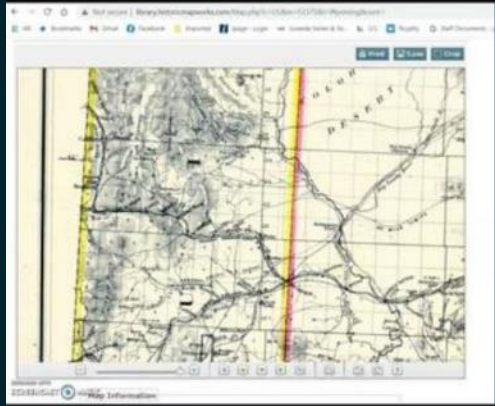

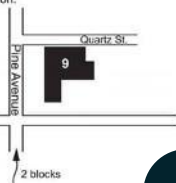


## Historic Kemmerer Walking Tour

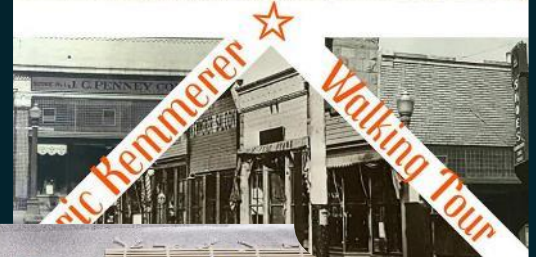
Researchers from the University of Wyoming and several local residents will present a panel discussion about themes and topics from this summer's oral history field school.

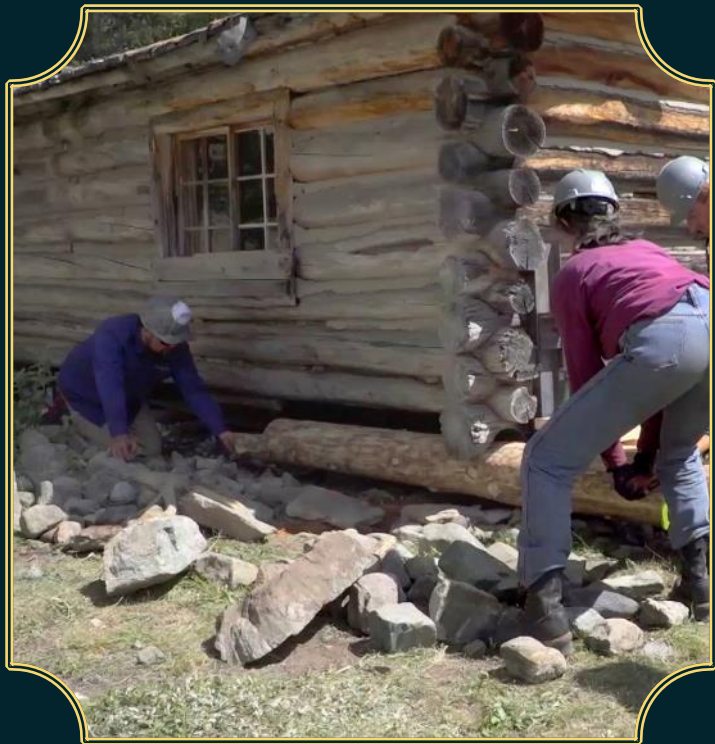
