





### #HeritageArea30: Making an Impact

Thirty years ago, National Heritage Area designation was conceived by community and National Park Service leaders looking for a new approach to conserve and develop the historic Illinois and Michigan Canal. This launched a national movement to unite preservation, conservation, recreation, education and economic development through national heritage areas.



Today visitors can hike and bike on the I & M Canal Towpath Trail and ride on replica boats. Looking back to the 1960 - 80's, this was unimaginable as the canal was all but forgotten. Leaders sought to unite the 96mile region from Chicago to LaSalle-Peru, not as a National Park, but as a National Heritage Area, including historic, cultural and natural sites, with homes, businesses, and industry.

Signed into law by native son, President Reagan on August 24, 1984, I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor's designation sparked a movement.

"I have witnessed the growth and maturity of the heritage areas movement, and of individual heritage areas, and am convinced of their effectiveness," wrote NPS Director Jon Jarvis in the NHA Policy Memo. "National Heritage Areas are places where small investments pay huge dividends, providing demonstrable benefits in communities across the country and in partnership with our national parks."







# Alaska National Parks



A "Mountain of a Man"A Seward pioneer was honored Tuesday by the Kenai Mountains—Turnagain Arm National Heritage Area (<u>www.kmtacorridor.org</u>). LeRoy Vincent Ray was a Seward lawyer and mining investor, a three-time mayor, and Senate president in the first Alaska Legislature. The 4,911 foot L.V. Ray peak can be seen from the south Johnson Pass Trailhead near Moose Pass. About 20 people gathered there for the dedication of a new sign telling some of L.V. Ray's story. The audience included Ray's great-grandson and his family. The national heritage area, established in 2009, uses federal funds from the National Park Service and matches them with private and other non-federal donations to help recognize, preserve, and interpret the historic, scenic, cultural and recreational resources of the area. This week also marks the 30th anniversary of the national heritage area accomplishments around the country, #HeritageArea30



### PRESERVING PLACES FOR PEOPLE

Thirty years ago, the first National Heritage Area, Illinois and Michigan National Heritage Corridor, was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan. In his dedication speech, Reagan, an Illinois native, referred to a "new kind of national park" that married preservation, conservation, recreation, education, and economic development. Today, the Illinois & Michigan Canal National Heritage Corridor maintains the 97 mile towpath as a hiking-biking trail that is located on same the path used by mule tenders and American Indians before them. Many historic structures, including canal locks and lock tenders' homes, that trace their existence to the canal still stand.

Since 1984, 49 National Heritage Areas have been established, resulting in much needed preservation projects and leading to significant economic development. Last year alone, the NHAs distributed over \$1 million in preservation grants and collectively preserved or maintained over 100 historic properties. Over 30 years, creative preservation strategies are taking root and making an impact in partnership with the National Park Service and many active citizens.

Pennsylvania's Rivers of Steel National Heritage Area embraced an unique partnership at the historic Carrie Blast Furnace. Unsecured for many years, the former US Steel Homestead Works was a magnet for graffiti artists in the Pittsburgh area. But when an artist noticed some interesting work during a tour, a unique partnership was born. Rather than paying to remove the graffiti, Rivers of Steel joined with artists to manage graffiti in a way that is beneficial to the site. A monthly urban art workshop and tour provides opportunities for visitors to learn about graffiti art, as well as the history of steel production. While steel manufacturing will never return to Carrie,

In Wheeling National Heritage Area preservation brought the historic Capitol Theatre back to life. This spectacular theatre closed its doors in 2008. It was reopened in 2009 with assistance from the Wheeling Convention and Visitors Bureau and Wheeling Sports and Entertainment Authority. Wheeling NHA staff provided grant management and technical assistance for the project, which supported 30 construction jobs and educational opportunities for preservation students. It has welcomed 200,000 guests since 2009.

Augusta Canal National Heritage Area's preservation program is providing a range of recreational, educational, and economic opportunities. The historic Enterprise Mill, which was shuttered in 1983, is now restored. This vast textile mill houses offices, apartments, a theater, and the Augusta Canal National Heritage Discovery Center. Restored hydroelectric generators provide power to the site while the excess power is sold to Georgia Power, generating revenue for programs. In 2001, The Augusta Canal Authority (ACA) acquired King Mill after the owners ceased operations. They leased it to a textile company, putting hundreds o

### 30 YEARS CONSERVING PLACES FOR PEOPLE

Conservation is a hallmark of National Heritage Areas. By conserving natural resources, National Heritage Areas in partnership with the National Park Service protect the character of place for the benefit of communities who live and work in the area. Conservation efforts lead to improved air and water quality, healthy ecosystems, beautiful places to live, and countless other benefits. Last year alone the NHAs distributed over \$4 million in grants for land and water conservation projects and collectively restored over 1,000 acres of land through invasive species removal, replanting and clean-up efforts.

In the <u>Hudson River Valley NHA</u>, the Rockland Farm Alliance (RFA) is aiming to increase the number of regional farms and sustainable farming educational programs. Through education and outreach, RFA helps prepare land for farming and provides guidance to new and emerging farmers. Similarly, <u>Blue Ridge NHA</u> (BRNHA) supports the Appalachian Sustainable Agriculture Project, which links new farmers to available land and stimulates farm tourism. BRNHA highlights traditional agricultural practices such as forestry and orchard keeping, as well as recent specialty crops like wine grapes and Christmas trees. They celebrate agricultural history as well as innovative agricultural development.

#### Shenandoah Valley Battlefields National Historic

District's battlefield conservation plan incorporates environmental protection, watershed work, agricultural development, as well as historic preservation. Since 2000, Shenandoah Battlefields Foundation has worked with local governments and property owners to double the amount of protected acreage in the area through easements. Much of the 6,000 acres are working farms, thus preserving the character of the battlefield while contributing to the economy.



#### In South Park National Heritage Area in Colorado, conservation is



incorporated into educational programs. For the second year running, staff partnered with the Coalition for the Upper South Platte to bring middle school students to High Creek Fen, a rare, ecologically diverse wetland. Students learn about water quality monitoring and biological indicators in class before completing field work on World Water Monitoring Day. This unique program combines laboratory science with field ecology, while increasing students awareness of issues in their community.

Students help monitor water quality at High Creek Fen in

South Park NHA in Colorado. Community organization is key in the Last Green Valley National Heritage Corridor, where volunteers and staff work to maintain 116 miles of waterway. In 2013, 208 volunteers dedicated 1237 hours at over 200 locations to monitor water quality. Water cleanup activities involved 1,100 people retrieving 13,500 pounds of trash.

Ambitious wetland restorations in <u>Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area</u> resulted in restoration of 1500 acres of wetlands within the challenging desert environment. The East Wetlands project is the result of a partnership with the City of Yuma, the Quechan Indian Tribe, Arizona Game and Fish Department, and the Bureau of Reclamation. The partners signed an agreement to each maintain 350 acres of wetlands in the Multi-Species Conservation (MSCP) Program, ensuring 50 years of maintenance.



The <u>Schuylkill River National Heritage Area</u> manages the Schuylkill River Restoration Fund Grant program, a private and publicly funded grant program designed to improve the quality and quantity of water in the watershed. Since its inception in 2006, 23 projects were successfully completed and an additional 17 are in progress. Results include thousands of feet of repaired stream-bank, invasive species removed along riparian buffers, and many best management practices installed in the five county

Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area Great Basin National Heritage Area: Explore a section of the largest U.S. desert and see the Bristlecone pine trees, which can live to be 5,000 years old. Great Basin NHA celebrates the Indians, settlers, miners, and explorers that were shaped by this unique region.



Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area: The Hudson River Valley extends 150 miles above the tip of Manhattan. The river runs three miles wide, carving between mountains and promontories - a glittering path followed by Indians, adventurers, George Washington's Continental Army, and Gilded Age millionaires. Today it is home many picturesque towns, parks, and trails to explore.

### 30 YEARS OF HERITAGE EDUCATION

National Heritage Areas preserve and protect historic and cultural resources by engaging the public through a variety of educational programs. NHAs work to reach new and diverse audiences, share meaningful stories, and connect residents, teachers, and students to history in their own backyards. Since National Heritage Areas need to match federal funding, they work with their partners to connect students and educators with natural and cultural resources as well as fostering civic engagement to strengthen the public understanding and relevance of heritage sites. In 2013 NHAs distributed over \$2 million in grants for educational projects and offered over 400 unique educational programs.

the National Park Foundation, partners and volunteers.

Over 30 years, <u>Illinois and Michigan National</u> <u>Heritage Corridor</u> has worked with community partners to educate the public in many ways, including a bicycle milemarker wayfinding system which was established in 2002. Mile marker signs give a fun fact about the canal and add interpretation and interaction between the trail, its history, and its users. Kiosks let trail travelers know about attractions near that marker. Larger signs interpret major stories along the canal. New 2014 signage with QR codes gives visitors educational and interpretive information to enhance their trail experience.

In 2012, the Essex National Heritage Area partnered with Seven Gables Settlement Association and the House of Seven Gables in Salem to conduct an outreach program titled Making the Caribbean Connection. The goal is to engage underserved Latino youths in discovering the untold stories of Salem and the Caribbean. Through hands-on projects, lectures in Spanish and English and visits to Salem's many maritime historic sites, students explore the interactions - both past and present - between the US and the Caribbean, where many of their families emigrated from. Students connect with the community while also gaining valuable language skills. The program was funded by a grant from



Essex students learning some of the finer points of shipbuilding.

The Northern Rio Grande National Heritage Area hosts the Puye Cliffs Hiking Program, which also blends history and language, albeit in a slightly different way. The program, created by the Santa Clara Pueblo, teaches pueblo youth about cliff dwellings, life styles, and the identification of traditional native plants. This information is presented by generational mentors in the Tewa language, helping to preserve the linguistic heritage of the region.

Each summer, <u>National Aviation Heritage Area</u> manages the <u>SOAR program</u> at the Dayton Air Show. This hands-on program offers low-income children of the area the chance to experience the air show. Nearly 20 unique STEM-related activities are provided by companies, universities, and programs.

Many NHAs focus on exploring learning opportunities through new media. Journey through Hallowed Ground National Heritage <u>Area's</u> Of the Student, By the Student, For the Student service learning project connects students to the American Civil War as they use primary source documents, music, dance, dramatic readings, acting and digital technology to create vodcasts or minimovies for National Parks within JTHG. Student-generated films become part of the NPS interpretive materials at the sites and are

### 30 Years of Recreation - Something for Everyone

As we reflect on 30 years since the creation of the first National Heritage Area, let's celebrate the recreational opportunities provided to our heritage area communities. NHAs improve access to the cultural and natural resources they were designated to celebrate and protect. Granting access to recreational opportunities is important for public engagement and stewardship, which are essential to the mission of all NHAs. Last year alone the National Heritage Areas distributed over \$3 million in grants for recreation projects and developed 1133 new miles of on and off road trails.

Many recreation projects in NHAs focus on the creation of multi-use hiking and biking trails such as

those along the Illinois and Michigan Canal National Heritage Corridor. Trails often take advantage of historic infrastructure - canals, industrial sites, and historic railways are points of intrigue for hikers, bikers, runners and walkers,

In Georgia, Arabia Mountain National Heritage Area completed a 30 mile hike-bike trail that connects historic, cultural and natural resources. Interactive maps enable trail visitors to map their route. Plans are also underway in partnership with a local mountain biking group to investigate opportunities for appropriate lowimpact mountain biking.



Lackawanna Heritage Valley National Heritage Area in Pennsylvania developed the

Lackawanna River Heritage Trail,

The Champlain Valley National Heritage Partnership and the Upper Housatonic NHA have collaborated with multiple

The success of the D&L Trail prompted the Landmark Towns Project, which aims to bring people from the trail to nearby

downtown areas.
