

East Austin's Tejano Trails




Quick Facts about East Austin

- Just east of downtown Austin
- Historically, the heart of the African American and Latino community
- History of redlining, community disinvestment
- Increasingly popular commercial and residential area
- Rapidly increasing property values, decreasing percentage of non-white residents
- Loss of historic homes;
 changing community character














The Idea

Why Partnerships?


- Represent a wide range of interests & voices

- Identify partners to assist with implementation




















Successes





- New partners: combining efforts with 5th St. Mexican American Heritage Corridor
 - Expand the Trails into downtown Austin
- Reaching residents and visitors through partners' networks
 - Helped to refine trail routes to better cater to residents' and visitors' needs
- Identifying partnerships to aid in implementation
 - Using in-kind donations from partners to pursue additional funding

Lessons Learned

- Create an atmosphere that promotes sustained engagement from partners
- Identify (and celebrate!)
 milestones/small victories
 along the way
- Start thinking about implementation from the start
- Expect limited capacity from your community volunteers (they're already busy!)
