

The Project

Background

The National Park Service (NPS) hosted a St Paul conference to promote the creation of support groups. At that meeting, several participants realized that we could look across the river at each other and despite jurisdictional boundaries we shared common interests, opportunities, and concerns. The idea of a "Great Rivers Confluence " project was born! Interested Confluence Project members then met for the <u>first</u> time in June 2009 at the Great River Road Visitor and Learning Center in Prescott WI (GRRVLC). The ideas and interests took hold and for the last three years this small group has grown to many engaged partners very active on a wide variety of topical Symposiums and activities. In a nutshell RTCA led Strategic Planning Workshop

- Confluence Vision: "Recognize and appreciate the confluence of the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers and its people, places, and stories through connections, partnerships and recreational opportunities"
- Confluence Mission: "To foster partnerships and connections across national, state and local levels, and to create and articulate a common vision of education, conservation and recreation at the confluence area of the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers. This collaborative effort will work to: increase recognition and appreciation of this area; enhance existing resources; acquire funding for education, conservation and recreation; and ensure that all people can enjoy these assets in the future".





Conclusion


- **Lessons Learned:** Don't wait make it happen! Engage partners early and often! Don't be afraid to ask for help! Just add water! Have fun and celebrate!
