## MANTUA: NEIGHBORHOOD CONTEXT

Mantua is a neighborhood in West Philadelphia that has suffered from low economic opportunity and high rates of poverty, unemployment, vacancy, and blight:

- 54% of residents live below the poverty line
- 21% of residents in the labor force are unemployed
- 32% of properties are vacant

#### The We Are Mantua!

Neighborhood Transformation Plan (June 2013) engaged Mantua residents to envision a new future for their neighborhood, including the revitalization of the physical environment




# MANTUA AVE REVITALIZATION

The revitalization of Mantua Avenue was identified as an early action priority in the We Are Mantua! plan

The Mantua Avenue corridor is currently characterized by:

- An unattractive railyard
- An unmaintained fence
- Litter & weeds
- Vacant land
- Unsafe transportation stops
- Low walkability & bikability
- Limited lighting



## THE MANTUA GREENWAY

Residents, inspired by Miss Bessie's Memorial Garden, developed the idea for the MANTUA GREENWAY



The project was adopted by the **We Are Mantua! Beautification Committee** in June 2013. The Committee worked with Philadelphia LISC to apply for NPS technical assistance to help get the project started

## GREENWAY PARTNERSHIP ACCOMPLISHMENTS

#### **VISION & CONCEPT PLAN:**

- Created a shared vision and work plan
- Partnered with PhilaU to complete concept designs

#### **RESIDENT ENGAGEMENT:**

- Solicited community feedback on concept designs
- Formalized a Resident Advisory Committee
- Organized several walks/programs along Mantua Ave

#### **PARTNERSHIPS AND FUNDRAISING:**

- Solidified support from Phila LISC for early action steps
- Partnered w/ Planning Commission to apply for feasibility study funding



#### GREENWAY PARTNERSHIP CHALLENGES & BEST PRACTICES

Challenge: Each partner/organization has their own language Best Practice: Spend time teaching and learning. Create a list of keywords & terms to distribute.

**Challenge:** Certain individuals may distrust the partnership (because of a past experience with one of the partners), even if they like the project **Best Practice**: Invest time in building relationships. Make sure everyone has the chance to voice their concerns, and make sure team addresses them directly and openly. A committed resident leader is invaluable.

**Challenge:** Balancing consistent v.s. targeted messaging **Best Practice**: Work together on common message that satisfies each person's needs, and also tweak when necessary.

**Challenge:** Managing Expectations. Trail projects take a long time! Challenge to communicate this without discouraging participation. **Best Practice:** Be honest about process, but also work with group on early action steps that you know are achievable in the near future.
